Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	4	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	5	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	4	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Reeve

This month has mainly been a case of supporting the Constabulary in dealing with major incidents across the county. This means that I have been abstracted from my role as Loddon Beat Manager to cover duties elsewhere for a significant portion of the month. I have had to put my own work plans on hold so I am now starting to catching up.

You may have read in the local press about a multi-agency operation that I ran at the end of August on a suspected puppy farm in Thurton. This led to a significant number of dogs being seized and offences identified and is a current ongoing investigation.

PCSO PIKE has been on leave this month for a couple of weeks but working with a member of the public he was able to identify a vehicle that had been driving anti-socially in the Church Plain car park. He tracked down the driver to speak to him and this was reinforced with a written warning. We will continue to monitor this area where possible and deal with issues identified however assistance from the public gives us a much better chance. So please report issues on 101, obtain registration numbers (if possible) or descriptions of vehicles committing offences or being used anti-socially (wheel spinning, excessive speed, loud exhausts etc).
