## Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.



## Message from your Engagement Officer

The Police and Crime Commissioner Lorne Green has regular formal meetings with the Chief Constable of Norfolk Constabulary to hold him to account for the policing service delivered in the county. These meetings are known as the Police Accountability Forum.

Members of the public are welcome to attend these meetings, which are held every other month in locations around the county. Each meeting is followed by a question and answer session, during which there is the opportunity to ask questions of both the PCC and Chief Constable.

Items on the agenda include how the Constabulary is performing against the PCC's policing priorities, how the police budget is being spent and financial planning for the future, and updates on major police investigations and initiatives.

## What is happening in your area

### Message from your Beat Manager Pc Reeve

This month I have been required to assist my colleagues on patrol on a number of occasions from covering bed watch duties at the hospital to dealing with domestic incidents and road traffic collisions. I have managed to deal with a number of ASB related incidents on the area including dealing with an anti-social driver at the Church Plain car-park, Loddon and issuing 5 verbal and written warnings to 5 drivers discovered using Church Road, Gillingham as a meeting point. We continue to patrol these areas and will deal with any issues discovered or reported. Repeat offenders at Church Road, Gillingham will be reported for breaching the Local Traffic Order however education is just as important as prosecution.

We have also had some success very recently by arresting two males in the Stockton area going equip to steal fuel/heating oil. This leads me on to advise everyone with an oil tank at home to check their security. This is particularly important now that the nights are drawing in and people are filling their tanks.
