Claxton Parish Pits Trust

On a lovely summer's evening we hosted a BBQ for the whole village, which was a great success and it was great to see many of our new residents. Thank you to those outside the Pits Trust who helped and a special thanks to the BBQ team.

As you will have seen we have supported the purchase of the SAM2. We also have money put aside to help in various ways, so if you think there might be something we could help with, please contact a member of the Trust. We are of course still offering assistance with the call system for those with particular needs in the village.

Following discussions and agreement between Claxton Manor Estate, the Pits Trust and Claxton Parish Council, work is now underway to convert the village allotments into a community orchard. The plan is to plant a variety of fruit trees with

the emphasis on traditional Norfolk apple varieties, undersown with meadow flowers to encourage pollinating insects and wildlife. This is a medium- to long-term project involving all three partners, with the aim of creating an amenity in the village by re-creating a traditional Norfolk orchard.

Fair on the Yare

Last month a circular was delivered to every home in the village, inviting your participation at an open meeting for ideas and help with the Fair, going forward. Disappointingly apart from the regular helpers no-one from the village attended. So it was with great regret that the Committee decided to call an end to the Fair for the time being. It is worth recording that since 2014 a total of £24,026.79 has been donated to the Fair's chosen charities.

St Andrew's Church

St Andrew's Church Parochial Church Council (PCC) are pleased to report that in June this year, following a donation from the Claxton Pits Trust, they were able to commission repairs to the church tower masonry. This work was completed prior to the first of three weddings held in the church this year. The PCC continues to aim to keep the churchyard and the church in good condition, supported by members of the wider Claxton community.

During this period of interregnum, with support from Reverend Mandy Ansell, church services continue, occasionally led by members of the PCC. Their fundraising efforts are ongoing, although the planned Musical Tea Party on 6th October had to be cancelled due to local flooding! The popular Ceilidh, with music by Small Fry, is being held on 23rd November in Claxton
