## The Kings' Speeches

This year marks 90 years since the first royal broadcast on Christmas Day. It would have been the 100<sup>th</sup> year except that when Lord Reith approached King George V in 1922, the King felt that the radio was purely for entertainment and so it wouldn't be appropriate for him to make a speech. Radio was still in its early days then, but 10 years later, he visited the BBC, learned more about it and was persuaded to make a broadcast. The speech was written for the King by Rudyard Kipling and delivered live from Sandringham on Christmas Day. 3pm was chosen as a time, because it was thought to be the most suitable for majority of the then Empire and Commonwealth to hear his words.

Making it happen involved putting in place a network of technical wizardry and on the day the challenges of trying to go live from a relatively remote location, meant the speech was delivered slightly late, but in the end, all went smoothly and the King's speech was heard across the world. If you visit Sandringham today, you can still see the rooms that were converted into a studio to allow the broadcast to take place all those years ago.

The tradition of a Christmas speech was firmly established by the Queen's father George VI, who famously addressed his people on the eve of war in 1939 using the Minnie Haskins poem beginning:

'And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year, give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.'

From then on, the broadcasts have taken place every year through time of war and of peace. The Queen took over from her father when she came to the throne in 1952, first on the radio and then, in 1957 also on the television and spoke every year.

For many people it has become part of the Christmas ritual, along with turkey and crackers. The image of families in party hats, gathering around the television to hear the Queen has been a regular scene in sit coms and soap operas for as long as I can remember. Yet for so many, the speech was a punctuation mark in the day, a pause in the festivities to listen and reflect and to remind ourselves of the world beyond our windows.

The Queen wrote her own scripts although she often had support from her husband Prince Philip and latterly her staff. She would speak about world events, events in her own life and almost always about her faith and how it had sustained her during the year that had passed. The former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, recalled being sent the text for approval, but saying that as she was one of the best speakers on faith in the church, he rarely, if ever, had anything to add.

Talking about her faith was something she never shied away from and something which she did with such sincerity and sensitivity that those of other faiths found warmth in her words, not offence.



This year, for the first time in 70 years, we will again have a King's speech. Only the privileged few will be able to remember the last one, so it will be something of a novelty for many people. Although the King has been a familiar figure to us for many years as the Prince of Wales, I am not really sure I feel I know much about him.

In his first address after the Queen had died, it was comforting to hear his promise to maintain the traditions and approach of his mother, but I am sure he will also want to put his own stamp on the institution of the Monarchy. In order to keep it relevant in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, it is almost certain that we will see some changes and reform. Undoubtedly things will come and go, but I hope the Christmas speech isn't one of the casualties and I hope he feels able to tell us something about the importance of faith in his life too.

But Charles III isn't the only king we will hear from this Christmas. Christians often refer to Jesus as the King or even the 'King of Kings', the one above all others. The angel who visited Mary to announce that she would be the mother of the Christ child talked of his 'kingdom' and there are so many references to his kingship in our hymns and reading. We sing 'Crown him with many crowns', and of Jesus as 'The King of Love' because his words, his speeches, were all of love. He wasn't a king living in a golden palace, with beautiful robes, noble friends and servants, Jesus sought out those on the edges of society, the poor, the sick, the weak and those who others shunned.

Yet in all that darkness his words were always that we should love and care for each other. He called for us to be generous to others and to put their needs before our own. It is Jesus's voice that runs through the Christmas messages of peace and goodwill that will fill our Christmas cards and greetings and I hope that above all the celebrations, when we hear our new King's speech we might also pause in our festivities to hear the voice of the one whose birth marked the start of it all 2000 years ago.





### **New Archdeacon of Norwich**



On Saturday 1st October, Revd Canon Keith James was installed as the Archdeacon of Norwich at Norwich Cathedral. The Bishop of Norwich, the Rt Revd Graham Usher, led the service which was open to everyone.

The new Archdeacon of Norwich, Revd Canon Keith James was born in New Zealand but his childhood was spent in the North West of England.

He studied at Leeds University and has served in Lincoln and Worcester dioceses in parish ministry in rural and urban settings. He moved to Norwich in 2015 to be the Continuing Ministerial Development Officer for the Diocese and Residentiary Canon of the Cathedral. In 2020, his Diocesan role changed to become Director of Ministry and in March 2022 he became Interim Archdeacon of Norwich in addition to this.

Revd Keith is married to Linda; a special needs teacher, and they have three adult children. He enjoys tea, travel and live sport, especially following the England cricket team and the mighty Burnley Football Club.

Keith divides his time between Norwich Cathedral and the Diocese, resourcing those in licensed ministry so that their ministries can flourish. This means that he works to support them with the practicalities of ministry and the inner demands of a life that are particular to clergy, whilst also making sure that they are aware of developments in thinking about ministry, mission and theology. The role involves sharing prayer and worshipping at the Cathedral. Keith is at Morning Prayer most days and often at Sunday services, as well as sharing in leading the worship and preaching.





### News from St Peter's Church

### **Chris Hawes**

35 years ago, Chris Hawes and his family came to live in Bramerton and started to attend St Peter's Church. In 1990 Chris was elected as a member of the PCC and two years later he took on churchwarden's responsibilities, which he carried out conscientiously for almost all of the 30 years since then.

He became the face welcoming you into church and he was keen to make services more interesting. Both Chris and Brenda, his wife, enjoyed poetry and this was introduced in special services to good effect. A poetry evening was organized by Brenda in Church and there were fund raising barbecues at Squirrels Drift and harvest lunches after the Harvest festival services.

During his time the Church has been well maintained. The interior of the Church has been redecorated, the organ refurbished, the dampness in the vestry has been reduced, the vestry renovated, and an electric motor now winds the clock. Outside the gutters on the south side of the Church have been replaced, the lychgate has been rethatched and a battle has been fought to keep the elderly slate roof watertight. When the diocese sold a nearby property the opportunity was taken to extend the Church car park which has made the church more accessible.

Chris introduced the book of remembrance and the carved wooden holders for gift aid envelopes, made by Chris Postle, which are in the pews at St Peter's Church.

Chris served on the Bramerton Group Council including as Secretary for some years and arranged the men's breakfast meetings and their speakers. He was also chair of the Bramerton

Society.

The photo shows Chris hosting one of the very popular annual Harvest Lunches, held in Bramerton village hall for many years, which helped to raise funds for the church.

Recently increasing health problems have meant that Chris has needed to leave Bramerton to get additional necessary support from his family in Surrey. He will be missed. We are thankful for all that Chris has done for St Peter's Church over the years and wish him every happiness in his new home near his daughters.

### **OBITUARY - Richard Crosskill**

The overflowing church of St. Peter's, Bramerton, told its own story. Family, friends and former business colleagues from near and far had gathered to pay their respects in a special Thanksgiving Service for Richard who died in September at the age of 86.

Devoted family man, business leader, wit,raconteur. Just some of the descriptions bestowed on one of Bramerton's best-known and respected figures who gave a lifetime of service to the local and wider Norfolk community.



Educated at the Norwich School and then the Leys School in Cambridge, Richard won a place at Emmanuel College, Cambridge to read law but with the death of his father he decided to remain at home and join the family wholesale chemists company Crosskills which was founded in 1810. He worked there as a director for 40 years before retiring at the age of 57.

Married in 1965, Richard and Merrilyn, known to everyone as Merry, moved to Bramerton the following year where they lived for 47 years. They had two daughters Alison and Caroline. Richard doted on his three grandchildren Connor, Finn and Olivia. More recently Richard and Merry moved to Framingham Earl, "just across the border" as Richard called it with his customary humour.

Richard's was a life filled with community and civic service. In his twenties he was Chair of the Young Conservatives in Norwich. In his thirties he became President of the Norwich Junior Chamber of Commerce before becoming President of the Norfolk County Association of Parish and Town Councils, having served as Chair on Bramerton Parish Council. He was also an independent member of Forehoe and Henstead Rural District Council.

For 36 years Richard served as a Magistrate on the Norwich Bench, retiring in 2006. He Chaired the 160-strong Bench from 1991-95.

Life was never dull for Richard. He edited the Eleven Says, the newspaper of the Bramerton Group of Churches, he served on the committee of the Bramerton Society, was a member of the local Bramrocks Drama group and Chair of Bramerton Relief-in-Need which helps residents at times of financial crisis. He was a passionate advocate for maintaining the local footpaths and wrote two books of walks within the Eleven Says area.

If that was not enough he found time after his retirement to complete an Honours Degree in politics and modern history at the University of East Anglia.

Ever the perfectionist, as his health deteriorated Richard selflessly set about easing the pain of his passing for the family. He chose the readings and hymns for his Thanksgiving Service and even outlined his obituary for the Eastern Daily Press.

And in a final and typically mischievous flourish he asked that the congregation at that final service sing the hymns he'd chosen with gusto. We did!!

### Sanyu Babies Home Kampala, Uganda.

For nearly thirty years our Eleven villages have been providing support for Sanyu Babies Home. We currently send a payment every month to cover weekly visits by the home's doctor and for the two full time nurses.



They and we are very grateful for your generous donations which make this support possible. Many of you buy plants from John and Ruth Everett of Applebee Orchard in Rockland. The Everetts, through their efforts as well as thanks to you have raised a significant part of our Sanyu funding. They have done, and are really doing wonders for Sanyu. Another vital source is the Churches in the group. But it is so many individuals that, especially at Christmas, provide lifelines for these babies.

Every quarter in their newsletters, we learn of unwanted Kampala babies literally thrown away in rubbish dumps or even pit latrines, of babies left on the steps of churches or police stations around Kampala. The stories often are heart-wrenching, but Sanyu accepts them, feeds, cares and nurtures them, whatever the circumstances. The Home provides whatever medical care they need and helps with early years education.

Sanyu, having been set up in the 1920s by an English missionary, is run and manned by Ugandans and much of the funds required are locally sourced. There are a few much-needed foreign supporters like us and very often young foreign volunteers on gap years, work at the home helping wherever help is needed. The newsletters always seem to sing the same song, not only of how the volunteers contribute so effectively to the lives of the babies, but also how often the contribution is two way. Being there gives them real benefit too.




