# This will not pass .....the rest is commentary

These are two of the most recent sayings of the Reverend Cate Turner who has spent the last 3 years as a training curate in the Thurton Benefice. During this time she has been supported superbly by husband lain, not to mention many members of the local churches. It has truly been a wonderful partnership.

Cate has now been licensed as Interim Rector in the parish of West Buckrose in Yorkshire. The benefice was represented by a small group of hardy travellers who were able to support Cate as she prepared for her new role.

At her interview Cate was very thankful for the way in which life in our benefice had prepared her for her new role. Things like Open The Book which brings bible stories to life in our primary schools and the different styles of worship we have explored in our churches.

The countryside in Yorkshire was very similar although there were a few more hills. Leaving the reception at 10pm involved getting stuck in country lanes behind not one, but two tractors!

During her last service at Bergh Apton on 30th July, Cate spoke about the love of God for all people on earth and whilst many things change, this is the one constant in life that we can rely on.

As Paul wrote in his letter to the believers in Rome "I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans, Chapter 8, Verses 38, 39).

There are all sorts of views and theological discussions which try to explain and expand on this remarkable claim, but is it not better to focus on the most vital truth that God loves us and the fact that this will never change? As Cate said "the rest is commentary".

Here are a few comments that people have made about Cate's time with us.

I have been struck by the way in which Cate has committed herself to serving all people in the Bramerton Group of Churches, taking on all sorts of roles and responsibilities which were probably never envisaged in the original plan.

Cate has always helped when asked. She has spent time in local schools and visited those who cannot easily get about.

She has shown huge amounts of compassion to help those in need and gone out of her way to help them.

She left us a wonderful legacy at Framingham Pigot of four beautiful 'falls' in liturgical colours that she made and embroidered to veil the Tabernacle where the reserve Sacrament is kept by the Altar. Definitely something that will always bring back memories of her ministry with us. Her sewing skills also came to the fore when she made several decorative cloth covers over notebooks to raise money for the church at our annual garden party.

Her thoughtfulness and kindness were also evident when she put together a large basket of sweet and savoury titbits and puzzle books for someone on a long and traumatic stay in hospital to boost their morale.

She will be greatly missed.

CATE: Calm, Caring, Capable, Called by God to be a Priest.

Who would have thought that this small, pale, humble woman could rise to the challenges and demands thrown at her during her curacy.

Well she certainly did.....and how!

Cate proved herself in exceptional pastoral care. All the services she planned and executed were conducted with great sensitivity and sincerity. Her confidence grew in both preaching and ministry and she wore the priestly robes with flare, pride and reverence.

She introduced the blue 'ThermosFlask' (Bluetooth speaker) when we were not allowed to sing in church and then progressed to using her own mobile phone recording and playing hymns as the need arose, even inviting us to choose our favourite hymns. She has a beautiful strong singing voice which we will miss.

She took over the worship time at the monthly Wednesday Fellowship meetings with ease and chaired church meetings e.g. APCM, showing a flare for organisation. We will miss her terribly, but God has a plan for her ministry and will continue to walk with her and guide her. We will hold lovely memories of her time with us and as we say "Bon Voyage Cate" I am reminded that she was asked to ring the large bell attached to the wall in Birdsall Church at her licensing service. Although Birdsall is a long way from the sea, the bell was engraved HMS Middleton!


## New! Film Night at the Barn.

# A continuation of Chris Limbach's front page story.....

# ... the context being Revd. Chris' letter that Revd. Helen read to the congregation at Revd. Cate's leaving service.....

I am very sorry not to be able to be with you all this morning as you gather to celebrate Cate and Iain's time in the Thurton Benefice and Bramerton Group and to wish them well as they prepare to embrace a new and exciting time in their lives and in Cate's ministry.

A few weeks ago I would not have dreamt that I would not be able to be a part of this day; sadly my physical and mental health has prevented it, but please be assured that you are at the centre of my thoughts and prayers this morning. The change in my circumstances and the impact it has had on Melanie, my family, friends and parishioners serves as a reminder of the unpredictability of life and, indeed, ministry.

Cate was ordained during the chaos and uncertainty of the

COVID restrictions in 2020; her ordination as deacon was attended by a handful of people rather than the hundreds which is the norm, and the first few months were very difficult with so many restrictions on meeting others.



The unsuitable house she and the family were allocated did not exactly help and the need to move to a new home outside the Group added further disruption.

But Cate did, what I soon learned Cate does, she coped, she adapted and she turned every challenge into an opportunity. Walking away from a successful, secular career where you feel confident and able, in order to take on the strange life that is the ordained one is daunting to say the least.

# Framingham Pigot Wedding

Robin SHERRY and Phillipa HICKS were married at St Andrew's Church, Framingham Pigot, on Saturday 8th July 2023.



The service was conducted by

Revd Cate and was the last wedding that she would do in our Benefice.

It was a lovely day and for Phillipa's family it was a joyful return visit to St Andrew's as her sister, Victoria, was married there in 2016.

I remember with a smile the first funeral Cate took the lead on; it was at Thurton and standing side by side in the graveyard as the bearers were lowering the coffin, Cate whispered to me: "Am I doing OK?" That self awareness, the willingness to learn from new situations and simple humility is what will stand Cate in good stead in the coming months and years as she integrates into a new Church community.

A moment I will not forget is Cate's ordination as a priest; again, there were restrictions and gallons of hand sanitiser in use and I was given the absolute joy and privilege of being the one to lay hands upon her as Bishop Graham ordained her. It is an experience that will never leave me.

Working and ministering alongside Cate has been one of the most special experiences of my own ministry; I am convinced she has taught me far more than I have taught her. Cate - I will miss you more than words can say. We had a lot of fun, a lot of laughter and a few tears as well. You have been a great support at some difficult times in my life in the last couple of years, not just in recent weeks; you gave me the space to take a sabbatical earlier this year and when I returned, I had nothing to pick up and do - it had all been done. But it is the nature of curacies that they are finite and now it is time for you to spread your wings and fly solo.

In the past three years I have seen you grow and flourish into the priest God has called you to be; go and be confident in who you are, the gifts you have been given and the ministry God has trusted you to undertake. You are unique, you are wonderful, you are you.

Cate and lain, may the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.
